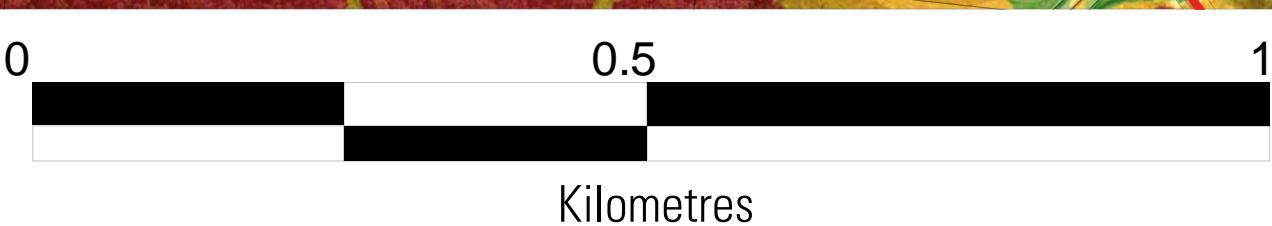

 MBRC actively undertakes a range of activities to manage bushfire risk and to maintain biodiversity values within its natural areas. If residents have any concerns they should contact the call centre on 3205 0555. Bushfire management is a community partnership and surrounding residents are encouraged to have bushfire survival plans for their residence and ensure their house is well prepared in event of bushfire. QFRS personnel in event of a bushfire should ensure MBRC is notified of the bushfire on MBRC owned/ managed land as per Standing Order via MBRC Call Centre 32050555. MBRC Fire Team know the area well and can assist with local knowledge and fire history. We prefer to be part of the early response so we can provide this information and feed into strategies for containing fires and work with QFRS in implementation of such strategies.
